Timothy R. Dillingham MD MS is a Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation physician and researcher, who is currently the *William J. Erdman II, Professor and Chair* for the Department of Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation (PM&R) in the Perelman School of Medicine at the University of Pennsylvania in Philadelphia, PA. His recent work involved a three-year randomized clinical trial of multidisciplinary care for persons suffering from long-COVID. He won the *Distinguished Researcher Award* in 2010 from the American Association of Neuromuscular and Electrodiagnostic Medicine (AANEM). Dr. Dillingham served as President of the AANEM from 2010 to 2011. He founded iFIT Prosthetics LLC in 2010 to address the many shortcomings of conventional prosthetics. In 2022 he won the AANEM Innovation Award, recognizing his development of advanced lower limb prostheses. In 2025 Dr. Dillingham won the Distinguished Academician Award from the Association of Academic Physiatrists.
