- Established in 2004
- Collaboration between PM&R & SHRS
- Provides clinical rehabilitation services & support research
- Pilot Grant Program since 2010:
 - build on a legacy of team science between PM&R and SHRS





Key Outcomes

- Continuously funded since 2010
- Funded:
 - 37 pilot grants
 - 34 distinct investigators
- Total of \$1,035,379 in funding

- Must align with federal research priorities (see website)

- Funding \$35,000 for 12 months
- No specific priority areas aside from above

Review Process

- Applications will be reviewed by faculty scientists with broad expertise in rehab research
- To avoid conflict of interest, specific expertise in specific domain of rehab research may not be possible
- Applications should be written with this in mind





Review Criteria

Proposals will receive an overall impact score using NIH criteria (1-9) and comments on the following:

- Significance
- Innovation
- Approach
- Investigator
- Environment

- Relevance to rehabilitation research as defined by PMR & SHRS in the call for proposals
- Potential to lead to a successful external funding application
- Collaboration among SHRS, PM&R clinicians not required but viewed favorably
- Special consideration will be given to junior investigators

Invitation to Submit Sent: March 27, 2023

Application Due Date: May 8, 2023

Anticipated Award Date: June 14, 2023
